This commit adds an implementation of the umount -O option, as provided by util-linux's mount(8) implementation, to BusyBox. Similar to -t, the option is intended to be used in conjunction with -a thereby allowing users to filter which file systems are unmounted by mount options.

Multiple options can be specified with -O, all of which need to match.

Each option can be prefixed with `no` to indicate that no action should be taken for a mount point with this mount option. The "no" prefix interpretation can be disabled using the "+" prefix.

At Alpine, this feature is often requested

by users as the OpenRC
netmount service uses `umount -a -O _netdev` to amount all network
file systems [1] [2].

This implementation is functionally equivalent to the util-linux
implementation with the exception that it implements no special handling
for `key="value"` mount options to keep the implementation simple.
Therefore, filesystems mounted with options like `foo="bar"` won't
be matched by `umount -a -O foo`.
