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Prefix Withdrawal

This alarm detects when a peer withdraws a prefix.

The withdrawal of a prefix from a few BGP peers does not necessarily mean that the prefix is unreachable since there are multiple paths to reach a prefix. However, if a large enough number of peers withdraw off the prefix in a geographical area, the reachability of the prefix can be degraded. It is recommended that thresholds for this alarm are set higher than other alarms to suppress noise caused by router flap.



Note It is useful to know which of your peers may be doing something wrong (leaking route information or having some type of misconfiguration) so that you can address the problem right away. A **My Peers** rule is available for this alarm with certain [Crosswork Cloud subscriptions](#). The **My Peers** option follows BGP updates *only* from your [peers](#), whereas **All Peers** follow BGP updates from your peers *and* global peers. Possible Problem Detected

This alarm can help identify a misconfiguration resulting in prefix withdrawal.
